#### **Video Vignette Recording Process**

Dear Link Sisters.

Your script information should follow the guidelines below:

- Include mandatory information:
  - Name
  - o STEM area focus, i.e., field of work
  - Area you are from City and State (and Country if you are external to the US)
  - Your EA Links Chapter (if you are a member of The Links, Inc.)
- Questions provided for HBCU, Mentoring, and STEM; please answer as many questions as possible. (See below)
- Share information about what you do for a living, mention your role/position
- Mention where you work, i.e., a major healthcare organization, IT firm, state university, etc.
- Recommendation is to use your phone to record
- Consider framing, lighting, etc.; check setting on your phone(s)
- Wear proper attire including no low-cut blouses
- Keep your face forward, remember you are communicating with persons
- Close out using the following hashtags (#):
  - For mentoring videos, use hashtag #Mentoring Matters
  - o For HBCU videos, use hashtaa #I Stand with HBCUs
  - For STEM videos, use hashtag #I Support STEMulating Careers

We request that all video lengths be **2 minutes +/- 20 seconds** and are be accompanied by the completed Links Media Release form (see attached). If you have questions about the videos, please contact:

Questions for each documented area are below. Please note, you **DO NOT** have to answer all questions in your video, but use as many as the 2-minute recording will accommodate:

# HBCU - See Example submitted by Link Tarrye Venable (hyperlink)

- 1. What HBCU did you attend and where is it located?
- 2. What was your major?
- 3. What are two reasons why students should attend an HBCU?
- 4. Briefly explain your most memorable experience at your HBCU.
- 5. How has attending your HBCU contributed to your success?
- 6. What do you know now that you wish you would have known earlier about HBCUs?

## Mentoring – See example submitted by Link Nakeina Douglas-Glenn (hyperlink)

- Outside of a family member who has been your best/ most influential mentor and why?
- 2. How did you get your first professional leadership position?
- 3. Would you do anything differently if given the opportunity?
- 4. What career accomplishment are you most proud of?
- 5. What three skills should I develop now to help me in my career?
- 6. What do you know now that you wish you would have known before I graduated from high school?

# <u>STEM – See example submitted by Link Pamela Walker (hyperlink)</u>

- 1. What was it that made you chose your area of STEM for your career?
- 2. What are the most important strengths anyone seeking a career in STEM should encompass?
- 3. What classes should be focused on when preparing for a role in STEM?
- 4. What advice do you have for a student who aspires to your area of STEM?
- 5. What one challenge have you overcome or opportunity you were afforded that was key to your success in STEM?
- 6. What do you know now that you wish you would have known earlier about STEM?

## <u>Criteria for Selection of Videos</u>

- Sharp, crisp and clear picture
- Enunciation and clarity of spoken words
- Presentation layout
- Information shared about career choice
- Included information regarding hashtag
- Demographical information included
- Compelling story that communicates why one should choose mentoring, an HBCU or a STEM career
